AGIC Leadership Workshops are officially an annual event. The workshops, typically held in February on the same day as the Council meeting, are intended for Council members to discuss the strategic and business priorities that AGIC will focus on for the coming year. While the workshops are meant to engage Council Appointees and Committee/Workgroup Leadership, they are open to the public and anyone with interest is welcome to attend. Please join us at the next AGIC Leadership Workshop on February 3, 2022 at 10 AM (this will be a hybrid event, the physical location TBD). The meeting details will be posted to the AGIC calendar.

In March 2021, the Council published the <u>AGIC Strategic and Business Plan for 2021</u>. The Council will update this plan annually following the annual AGIC Leadership Workshop (see above post). All plans will be posted to the <u>AGIC Publications &</u> <u>Resources Website</u>.

The new AGIC Mentorship Program has officially begun. The year-long program kicksoff in January 2022. While applications to participate are no longer being accepted, AGIC does plan to continue the mentorship program annually and will open the next round of applications in the fall of 2022. AGIC has four new Committee and Workgroup sites on AZGeo: the AGIC Natural Resources Workgroup, the AGIC LiDAR Workgroup, the AGIC UAS Workgroup, and the AGIC 9-1-1 Committee. AZGeo has partnered with agencies throughout the state to develop specialized solutions for different stakeholder needs. Currently, AZGeo has four highlighted partnerships, including the ADOT Arizona GeoData Supply Chain, Arizona Sun Cloud, ADOT Research Center, and Arizona Wildfire Risk Assessment Portal.
