
- GDA Amendment: changes reporting requirements, implements fiscal reporting with oversight from OMB, recommends an NSDI governance study
- NHD & 3DHP
 - 3DHP FTN Information hub
 - 3DHP FTN Dashboard
- FLAIR Act
 - A modified version of the Federal Land Asset Inventory Reform (FLAIR) Act was enacted into law as part of the Omnibus appropriations bill President Biden signed on December 29. P.L. 117-328 provides for a current and accurate inventory of Federal land owned by the Department of the Interior as well as the U.S. Forest Service. The FLAIR Act will assist surveyors and others, when doing records research or building a GIS, by making such data access and integration much more efficient.






Admin and Legal Committee

Action Item 1: Motion to approve a maximum of \$2,500 to support half of the registration and/or travel expenses for the AGIC officers who will be attending the 2023 NSGIC annual conference.

 Reason for action: The AGIC Manual states that "At least one officer from the Council, either the Chair, Vice-Chair, or Past-Chair, is expected to attend the NSGIC annual and mid-year conferences. Other officers may be sent to the conferences depending on availability of funds and contingent upon approval by the Council. Unless the Council approves additional funds, AGIC will provide half of the travel and registration cost to NSGIC functions. Az CORS

The Az CORS Workgroup was established to explore a collaborative approach to supporting the long-term viability of the Arizona Continuously Operating Reference System (CORS) network. The group will work closely with the National Geodetic Survey (NGS) and Arizona Professional Land Surveyors (APLS) to enable best practices for station maintenance, sustainable funding, and data maintenance and storage.

The Cadastral Workgroup was established to facilitate informational exchange among stakeholders regarding best practices and use guidelines for cadastral reference systems in Arizona to enhance and support state, federal, and local government business systems

4D Geospatial Data

The AGIC 4D Geospatial Data Workgroup (4DGDWG), formally the LiDAR Workgroup, is focused on promoting all aspects of LiDAR (Light Detection and Ranging) efforts in Arizona, including information exchange to facilitate LiDAR acquisition and collaboration (especially though 3DEP program), the distribution of LiDAR related products via AZGeo, education and outreach, and the development of best practices and data standards materials.
