- Outreach Committee Updates
 - Al work is moving. They have built an AZGeo StoryMap template and are building other templates. It would be good to have them share the updates at the next meeting. They are continuing lunch and learn events and those are successful.
- Data Committee Updates
 - Howard stepping down as co-chair and Brooke nominated.
 - Data sharing reforming to finalize data sharing guidelines. Jim requested push to help Steve with the workgroup.
 - Imagery still moving forward
- Symposium Presentation Topics
 - Could show and discuss Category updates and other updates to the hub site
 - Shea wants to know if we can build on that to get audience participation
 - Sharing data back and forth between Enterprise and AZGeo
 - 2 or 3 speakers using AZGeo as collaboration tools like ADOT
 - Hear from others with Hub sites to see how they are using it and how they are sharing data
 - Shea wants to hear what others are doing

 - User types and licensing!!! Sage has great ideas for user types (hub vs enterprise vs AGOL)
 - also MPA and what components are in the MPA
- Data Curator Position
 - ASLD has posted the position and are actively working on hiring.

IV. Follow-up items [Minute 4:45]:

- AZGeo Open Data Portal
 - Ryan reported there is a lot of content in the Open data portal and it can cause searches to be frustrating. Our recommendation: remove all data sources from the open data page if they are not from AZ or one of its counties/cities. Could create a petition form people can submit to re-add sources deemed important or authoritative. The AZGeo Advisory can review the request and, if determined authoritative, return the item to the open data portal. Petition form can also allow category change suggestions and propose new data items. Could add a separate page for resources that are outside of Arizona, are not authoritative/trusted, but could be valuable.
 - 1. Lissa Klun, ADEQ, notes it was also difficult to find regularly updated datasets in AZGeo.
 - Shea shared the results of a recent AZGeo satisfaction survey. Had 51 responses. Challenges are search and navigation, data availability and currency, and some organizational/user challenges. Recommendations are people want enhanced search and accessibility, data availability, and improved collaborations.
- AZGeo Categories Updates
 - Shea presented results and said we are working on it
- 2025 user meetings and user engagement
 - Looking for opportunities in addition to the conference.
 - Could do a lunch and learn session (since Outreach are doing those).
- AZGeo Presentations and Data Spotlights
 - Similar to the discussion above. Lucas will bring the idea to the outreach committee and if they want to then bring it back to AZGeo
 - One idea is to have a WG that has people from data and outreach and AZGeo that come up with ideas for these spotlights and lunch and learns etc. I suggest this knowing that everyone is already very busy.
 - We also can set up a section on AZGeo to highlight these pretty easily too.
- Premium data store, credits and MPA
 - SPO signed the MPA and so we were able to get the Premium data stored turned back on. We were able to get most of our credits back as well.
 - Esri doesn't like that our premium data store is attached to our

community hub and has asked us to rearchitect the system by 2026. This has quite a few challenges.
