- II. <u>Approval of January Meeting Minutes:</u> January meeting minutes were distributed prior to the meeting via email. Jenna asked for a motion to approve the minutes as written. Eric motioned and Patrick seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously without discussion.

- Announcements
  - o Draft AGIC Strategic and Business Direction

o Esri Spotlight

AGIC was approached by ESRI as they would like to do a feature story on AZGeo. Details are being worked through on the legalities of this ask.

• Draft Work plan review

Eric, Kevin, and Ryan worked collectively to come up with a draft work plan for this committee, that will be submitted for approval by the council at their meeting in May. Eric emphasized the importance of the user feedback mechanism, to continue receiving input from stakeholders. This is likely achieved through the User Group meetings and surveys throughout the year. After group discussion, Jenna asked for a motion to approve the Advisory Committee's Draft 2022-2023 Workplan. Howard motioned and Eric seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously without discussion.

Jenna asked for input from this group on what has been drafted as the User Group Meeting Agenda.

- Data Management
  - AZGeo Technical Group Activities
    - Large data storage

A virtual server has been spun up with a storage cluster of 4,000 terabytes. The interface for users would show folders on a web interface where the user is able to download data in a zipped folder. Testing was done by using a portion of LiDAR and checking it's operability with ArcGIS Online. With the testing pool of users, its functionality has worked great.

• State Facilities Board Application

This project was brought to our attention to develop an application for transparency to the public on the use of capital funds and improvements in schools. A proof-ofconcept application was created in December. That was widely accepted, and work is moving forward on making the application's functionality more detailed.

Broadband

The Arizona State Land Department is supporting the Broadband's office in serving broadband to the state for both infrastructure purposes, as well as individual access.

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• Utilization of Credits on AZGeo

Ryan spoke to the group about the high usage of credits on AZGeo. The AZGeo technical team has been working on the back end to find a solution. It has been discovered that there is no real way to limit credit usage per user. They are working with users to move large data sets to the Enterprise server where they will have the same functionality and perform better.

• AZGeo Feedback/User submissions

Kasey has handled submissions as they come in. Since the last meeting only a couple items have come in, both being general items.
