GOALS AND ACTIVITIES:

1. Provide a forum and structure to discuss items related to a 9-1-1 system to support current and Next Generation 9-1-1 geospatial data, initiatives and technologies
 - Create and sponsor work groups as needed
 - Collect and support repository of completed 9-1-1 System Administrator work flow plans to be able to share with other System Administrator's.
 - Facilitate the statewide needs for 9-1-1 GIS data layers, applications, and coordination
 - Identify potential resources required to carry out proposed activities
 - Coordinate as needed with other AGIC Committees to carry out proposed activities

2. Facilitate and coordinate state-wide data sharing to support 9-1-1 systems
 - Create and sponsor work groups as needed
 - Encourage and propagate the message for building a repository of agreement templates between PSAPs and 9-1-1 System Administrator and agreements between 9-1-1 System Administrator and the AZ 9-1-1 Office.

- Serve as a forum to facilitate informational exchange related to a 9-1-1 system between state, federal, tribal, regional, and local governments, the private sector and professional associations.
 - Coordinate as needed with other AGIC Committees to carry out proposed activities
3. Help build repository of educational tools to foster education of 9-1-1 Dispatchers to understand GIS map functions in a Next Generation 9-1-1.
- Creation of a 9-1-1 dispatcher education working group (4 to 5 people) as a mechanism to meet this goal.
 - Outreach to 9-1-1 professionals for feedback and review
